PRESIDENT'S REPORT JUNE 2023

On a trip to Perth on Wednesday 7 June the ACEO visited the offices of Beilby, Downing, Teal and met with the Cosultant who will be assisting Council with the CEO recruitment where we discussed the process prior to engaging with the Committee.

The ACEO and I went to the Battye Library in Perth to speak to the Staff and seek information on Niagara Dam and reserve. Of particular interest was a discussion with Dr Michael O'Connor, Digital Programs Officer, State Records Office of WA, with an overview of how to approach research on a particular subject.

On Monday 12 June, along with Crs Warner, Dwyer and the ACEO we flew from Kalgoorlie via Perth and Sydney to Canberra to attend the Australian Local Government Association National General Assembly that was held at the National Convention Centre. Crs Sudhir and I Baird arrived from Melbourne later that night.

At the opening Ceremony, the Federal Minister Catherine King, Minister for Infrastructure, Transport, Regional Development and Local Government spoke on those topics in her portfolio. Following the ALGA President, Linda Scott's address, the Guest Speaker was announced, His Excellency Vasyl Myroshnychenko, Ambassador of Ukraine who had returned to Australia from spending the last month in Ukraine. He expressed great gratitude on behalf of the people and Government of Ukraine in the support, both aid and humanitarian by the Australian Community and Federal Government in the ongoing conflict. His talk was very well received by those in attendance. An address was then delivered by the Honourable Peter Dutton MP, Leader of the Opposition.

Councillors viewed the exhibition and display and then did a field trip on the Light Rail System from the main station to the end and return to the station near the Hotel where we all resided. At 5pm we attended Rick Wilson MLA Office in Parliament House for refreshments, along with other Local Governments in Rick's electorate of O'Connor, attending the National General Assembly.

Councillors and the ACEO attended a Buffet Dinner, with entertainment and Trivia Quiz, back at the Convention Centre in the evening.

Thursday morning Councillors heard from a panel, a conversation about The Voice, four people speaking for The Voice. Courtesy of Rick Wilson MLA limited tickets for the public gallery for question time in Parliament were utilised by Councillors for attendance at 2pm.

All Councillors and the ACEO attended a free dinner in the Great Hall at Parliament House that evening at which the Prime Minister, Anthony Albanese and Minister for Indigenous Australians, Linda Burney, were announced as Special Guests. Both guests spoke at length about supporting The Voice in the upcoming referendum later in the year.

All Councillors and the ACEO flew out of Canberra on Friday (at various times) to Melbourne, Perth and arriving in Kalgoorlie. ACEO remained in Perth until Monday.

I attended the Briefing Session on Thursday 22 June via video conference.

Conference Attendance in Canberra a Success

Councillors G Dwyer, J Dyer, S Sudhir. I Baird and P Warner, along with the Acting CEO

attended an Australian Local Government Association congress in Canberra from 12 to 16 June.

The Annual Congress brings local government representatives from the whole of Australia to

discuss issues of national importance to local government. Over 1,000 delegates attended to hear various Federal Ministers (including the Prime Minister) give presentations.

One of the main (and consistent) messages was that the Federal Government saw local government as a 'trusted partner' for the delivery of services. This is a positive message as it is a good indicator that grant funding will continue to be forthcoming to local government.

Another consistent message was that the financial sustainability for local government was the biggest issue that kept local government elected representatives and CEOs awake at night. Although the Shire of Menzies isn't threatened by financial sustainability, councillors are nevertheless aware that this may not always be the case and financial oversight and prudence is crucial t our ongoing prosperity.

One example given was that of the Borough of Woking in the UK which recently needed to be rescued financially after achieving a financial deficit of 1.2 billion pounds. In an environment of reduced central government funding in the UK, it is good to know that the Australian Government has committed to working with local government.

An interesting talk was given by the Lord Mayor of Melbourne, Sally Capp, who spoke about the future of the workforce in local government. It is no secret that it can be hard to recruit in remote locations like Menzies and this has already been acknowledged in the Shire's Workforce Plan. However, this phenomenon is Australia wide. As an aside, the shire has recently welcomed two new employees, Joel Bone and Sean McGay to our 'family', in the positions of Building Maintenance Officer and Community Development Manager respectively. Both are doing brilliantly and we are indeed blessed to attract such high level applicants to Menzies.

The Lord Mayor said that if it was difficult to attract the right staff we should all try and 'grow' them from within. Our Chief Financial Officer, Kristy, who until recently was our Senior Finance Officer, was 'grown' from within and has already finished off our annual accounts and is proceeding professionally and competently on our budget for 2023/24.

MESSAGE FROM THE **CEO**



A lot of time at the Congress was spent on disaster recovery which has affected so many people right across Australia. Also, time was spent on cybersecurity which has become a huge problem world-wide. The issues of climate change and the Voice to Parliament referendum also received a lot coverage.

All councillors had the opportunity to attend question time and to also enjoy the hospitality of Federal Member Rick Wilson MP.

The Congress should be seen as a success. Councillors (and CEOs) need to be prepared to see how others are doing things and to find out what might work and what hasn't worked. In fact, former Minister Darren Chester said just that. He noted that by coming to the Congress there existed an opportunity to find solutions to problems as it would be very unusual for one particular local authority to have a unique problem. He said that for every eight problems, somebody somewhere would already have solved five of them.

Objects and Reasons for Rating in the Shire of Menzies 2023/2024

INTRODUCTION

In accordance with section 6.36 Local Government Act 1995, the following information details the objective and reasons for proposed Differential of minimum rates.

Basis of Rating

The overall objective of the proposed rates in the 2023/2024 Financial Year Budget is to provide the net funding requirements on the Shire's services, activities, financing costs, and current and future capital requirements to achieve a balance budget.

The basis for property rates is calculated using two types of values; Gross Rental Value (GRV) which generally applies for residential, commercial, urban areas; and Unimproved Value (UV) which is generally applies for rural land values are provided by Landgate.

Rates for 2023/2024

For the 2023/2024 financial year, the Council has endorsed a 3.6% increase to total rates revenue of \$4,335,809.96. For the financial year 2022/2023 the total amount levied, including interims, was \$4,179,686.00

Updated Valuation

Updated Unimproved Values (UV) for rural properties are provided every year, and updated Gross Rental Values (GRV) for residential, commercial, and special rural properties are provided every three to six years, depending on Landgate's Valuation Schedule.

The following table of Rate in the dollar and Minimum payments are applied for 2023/2024 financial year:

GROSS RENTAL VALUE (GRV).

This category includes all residential, commercial, and vacant lots within the townsite of Menzies. The object of the rate in the dollar for this category is to raise sufficient revenue to offset the costs associated with the provision of current and future services. This rate ensures all ratepayers make a reasonable contribution towards the ongoing maintenance, provision of works, service, and facilities in the Shire.

The 2023/2024 financial year rate in the dollar is 8.9400 cents and the minimum rate is \$200 for all Gross Rental Value (GRV) properties.

UNIMPROVED VALUATION (UV)

This category includes all Mining, Exploration and Prospecting Leases. Pastoral land is also included. The 2023/2024 financial year minimum rate \$328 applies to all Unimproved Valuation (UV) categories.

Objects and Reasons for Minimum Rates

Local Government Act 1995, Section 6.35

The Council has established minimum rates for each Rate Category. These amounts represent the minimum rate that should be charged and may exceed the result of calculating a property's rating basis valuation (GRV or UV) with the rate in the dollar for the rate group.


Minimum rates have been prepared to comply with the Local Government Act 1995 which requires no more than 50% of properties to be levied on a minimum rate unless Ministerial approval is obtained.

The 2023/2024 Differential Rating is compliant with the Act and Ministerial Approval is not required.

1080 BAITING in this area is a risk to domestic pets

Using 1080 poison are carried out across Western and injury reducing the Australian, including this area, and are aimed at controlling wild dogs, feral cats, feral pigs, foxes and rabbits. The poison baits remain toxic for many months. You need to excise caution. Domestic pets should be kept close and under control at all times. Owners may consider the use of leads and muzzles for their domestic pets.
