

SHIRE OF MENZIES Council Meetings 2009

Council Meetings are usually held in the Council Chambers at the Menzies Town Hall Next 3 Ordinary Meeting of Council will be -

May - Thursday 28th at 9:00am, June Thursday 25th at 9:00am and July Thursday 23rd.

Please note that for 2009 all Council Meetings will be held on the 4th Thursday of each Month.

The general public are welcome for question time at the start of each months Council Meeting.



Matters arising from the Ordinary Meeting of Council held Thursday 23rd April 2009.

1. The Kookynie Road Rail Crossing Re-alignment project.

Council addressed tenders for this project and supported the variation to this concept by varying the original proposal by retaining the rail crossing in its present location and re-aligning the road. There are statutory approvals required before this project can proceed, though it is expected this will occur within a few weeks and then the tender can be accepted, as Council plans to complete this project by June 30th, 2009.

2. Lake Ballard Development.

This valuable project was again embraced by Council an tentative funds were allocated to the 2009/10 year budget, but subject the results of grant applications. Future considerations were addressed and council supported the convening of a meeting of the Management committee to discuss the way forward in the short term. Thus exciting times are ahead for this community with this project.

3. Caravan Park Upgrade.

The plan for the caravan park was approved by council and this is particularly important as this enables the consulting engineer to design the specifications for the Water reticulation, Electrical components and road network to proceed to tender. This major project for this council is progressing at a rapid rate and Council is keen to see this draw to a conclusion by June 30th, 2009. Already the water re-cycling facility has been installed, the earthworks prepared and the fencing has commenced. The contract for the ablutions has issued and it is anticipated the tenants will re-locate to the new facility by the end of June.

4. Local Authority Reform Strategy.

Council responded to the Ministers questionnaire as required and will address the future of the Shire in the ensuing months with a submission on considerations of how a reform package might improve the services being applied to this Shire community. This submission is required to be in the hands of the Minister by August 31st, 2009. Accordingly, it is anticipated that by the end of the year a clear picture for the res-structure of the State might be well known.

Matters arising from the Ordinary Meeting of Council held Thursday 23rd April 2009 (cont.)

5. The Leonora / Menzies Local Justice Agreement.

Council supported the agreement with the State Attorneys Dept for a Justice agreement subject to submission of the final document and this is expected in a month or so. However the concept does unite the philosophy of an agreement for this community and a plan towards retarding criminal behaviours for the improved quality of life for all concerned.

6. Kookynie Information Bay / Interpretative Plan.

This project is being fast-tracked with council endorsing the proposed plans as submitted with an anticipated conclusion by June 30th, 2009. Accordingly this great project will be a wonderful fillip to Kookynie and Council is pleased to see the project develop and progress as promptly as it has.

7. The Truck Bay Assembly Area.

The consulting engineer submitted a plan to Council as an indicative plan for the possible development of the site and this was approved. Thus, the project can progress and it is anticipated that the ground work and design will be completed by June 30th, 2009, in readiness for the ablution and lighting installation in the 2009/10 year.

8. Aged Care Housing Concept.

Another innovative concept was supported by council in the provision "In Principle", is the establishment of a Well-Aged" village of four units to be established near the nursing post, subject to the public consultation process and funding to support this idea. Accordingly, this is planned as a staged event with the future incorporating a "Frail- Aged village and Retirement village complex. Accordingly this exciting concept will be a great boon for the town and further advices will issue in this regard shortly.

9. Community Needs Survey.

The results of this survey were presented to Council and supported with the resolution being to forward these results to the consultant to incorporate into the "Corporate Plan". Accordingly, opportunity is taken to express our gratitude to all participants who made contributions to this survey and recognise that your views are important and indeed the Consultant will weave your views into the Corporate plan, which is planned to issue to Council in June. Further advices will issue in this regard shortly.

10. EFTPOS and B Pay Facilities.

Council also approved of the facilities of EFTPOS and Bpay for the payment of accounts through the Resource centre to commence July 1st, 2009. Accordingly, this is another great step towards enhancement of the services provided by the Shire and a great step forward with the improvements to the guality of life for the community of Menzies...

11. Budget Review - Year Ended 30/6/09.

Whilst a some-what mundane matter, the council addressed the budget review in April and supported the amendments which still embraces the "Balanced Budget" concept which is very encouraging and displays good controls over the costs and accounting aspects of the operations by the Councillors. Thus, the budget is on track and great advances are being made and controlled by Council.

12. Mining and Exploration Licenses.

Council also approved three mining applications which is also encouraging indicating that the activities in the mining sector are still positive for this region and sets the pace for the future for this Shire. Accordingly, Council maintains a very positive outlook for the future and where further advices will issue as these matters unfold.





From the 4th floor of the grand stand where I worked each day, you could see the whole racecourse and surrounding gardens and directly below you looked down on a sea of tents, caravans, camper trailers and recreational vehicles on display at the show. Spinefex Art Stories - Profile of Artist

Tjaduwa (Angelina) Woods

Spinefex Art Gallery is inside the Menzies Visitors Centre, the 'Former' Lady Shenton Hotel. Artist Tjaduwa (Angelina) Woods was born 1/07/1954 at Ilkawitjara., her Language is Pitjanjatjara.

Angelina's art is part of the Spinefex Arts Project at the Tjuntjuntjarra Community approximately 750kms east of Menzies.

This is her Art Work Story - Nguraku

Tjaduwa lived a fully traditional hunter gatherer lifestyle in the Great Victoria Desert until 1996 when her family group was contacted by family from Tjuntjuntjara and brought in to the community. Tjaduwa is a skilled bushwoman and a keen painter with the Spinifex Arts Project. In this painting she paints her homelands, or the place she was born and grew up.

Born at Ilkawitjara around 1954 Tjaduwa specifically mentions the sites of Utirraa, Baltabitjii, Wangutjirrii, Wangutjirrii kulinbah, Angbarrabarra, Artanyirri, Tarli parapara, Yarlingkatjarra, Yarlingkarra Tjukulla and Kaputjarra.

Other Peoples Stories ~ 10 Deserts Solo Cycle Epic

Name: Russell Worthington Age: 38 Lives: Brisbane Occupation: Engineer - Desert Ride Route

Welcome to the site of my 10 Deserts Solo Cycle Epic. On 1st May 2009, I'll roll out of Alice Springs heading N.W. onto the Tanami track. My plan is to follow the route below in counter-clockwise direction. The route traverses some of the most inhospitable terrain this continent has to offer, including 10 deserts and over two thousand sand dunes. On two occassions I will have 80lt of water onboard for a week's travel where there is no reliable water source. The total distance projected is approx. 7500km, and estimated time to complete is 11 weeks. You are invited to track my progress over the course of this adventure.

My motivation for embarking on such a ride is simply the desire to experience magnificent outback Australia on its own terms, and with sense of adventure. I hope following this adventure and witnessing my highs and lows can inspire those that can to make a do-

nation to the Royal Flying Doctor Service charity.

Follow up: My aims are: To ride this route solo and unsupported -

The expedition route traverses the three single biggest desert crossings in Australia, and covers a broad cross-section of all the desert environments in Australia. The expedition includes two significant firsts and I believe will also be the longest continuous ride in such conditions:

First crossing of the Great Victorian desert (Anne Beadell Hwy) by bike

First crossing of the Simpson desert (via proposed route on unconsolidated terrain) by bike

For safety reasons, my father and uncle will be within back-up range nearby

the Great Victorian and Simpson deserts. To raise funds for the Royal Flying Doctor Service - $\,$



To see and experience the great Australian outback -

177km NW of Alice Springs, I will roll off the black-top for what will be the beginning of a roller-coaster ride (albeit a very slow one) into the heart of this great continent. In an estimated 11 weeks, I'll have plenty of opportunity to experience its immensity, its solitude, see the geography, feel the history, share its spirit, brave the weather, gaze upon the stars, delight in the adaption of the local critters, all the while questioning whether I have the resolve to see this adventure through to the end.

To take only photos and leave only tyre tracks in my quest to highlight how beautiful this country is, and why we all need to preserve it for generations to come. Has anything like this been done before?

Several of the "lesser" deserts have been ridden before. These are really just dirt roads with limited water supply. There are also 3 "major" desert crossings included in this route. These are the Canning Stock Route, the Anne Beadell Highway, and the Simpson Desert (proper). Only one person, Jakub Postrzygacz, has ever ridden the CSR unsupported. He did this in 2006. By his own account, Jakub took 33 days and lost 18kg in body-weight on this route. To the best of my knowledge, no-one has ever ridden the Anne Beadell Hwy or through the heart of the Simpson desert. Certainly no-one has ever ridden all of these deserts before in one

continuous push. Let's see if I can ...

Gwalia Museum Stalwart Retires

Eric Omodei retired from volunteering at the Gwalia Museum in Leonora this week after 36 years with the organisation. Mr Omodei was one of the first volunteers when the Museum was first opened in 1972 and has enthralled and guided countless thousands of visitors during his time at the site.

Having lived in the same house in Gwalia since April of 1944, Eric, now 87, has been a regular fixture of the Museum on a Sunday, and was always ready with a memory, an anecdote, or a witty saying, and visiting descendents and ex-residents of Gwalia find that he can tell them many things about their friends and relatives. He also loved a good chin wag, especially in his native Italian, like so many of the miners of the era.

In Mr Omodei's usually stoic way, he refused a send off in honour of his achievement with a simple "It's time...". While Museum Director John Watson wasn't keen to let the event pass unnoticed, he had to abide by Eric's desire to keep his low profile. In thanking Eric, Mr Watson said "I was always happy to talk with him when I could, he truly fitted that old maxim 'he's forgotten more than I will ever know' and these things will be greatly missed, not just by me, but by all the people who will visit on a Sunday from now on, and won't have the pleasure of it."

Eric will now spend more time in his garden where he grows some of the most amazing Sturt Peas, year after year.

All money raised from A2B4C will go directly towards CCIA's research into the causes, prevention, better treatments and cure of childhood cancer.







Important Info For Seniors

Free Public Transport Travel Entitlements - WA Seniors, Aged and Disability Support Pensioners

Effective: Saturday 4 April 2009

From Saturday 4 April 2009, WA Seniors, Aged and Disability Support Pension cardholders will be entitled to travel for free on all regional town services between 9.00am and 3.30pm

Monday to Friday, all day Saturday and Sunday, as well as public holidays. If you are a WA Senior, Aged or Disability Support Pension cardholder using regional town services in Albany, Bunbury, Busselton, Carnarvon, Kalgoorlie and Port Hedland you will need to present your WA Seniors, Aged or Disability Support Pension card as a 'flash pass' when boarding a bus. During the free entitlement period you will not be charged a fare. Outside of the free entitlement period normal concession fares apply. If you intend to use Transperth services in Perth or regional town services within Geraldton you cannot use your concession pass as a flash pass. You must use a Seniors SmartRider or the new Pensioner SmartRider to access the free travel entitlements. 
