FROM THE ORDINARY MEETING OF COUNCIL



THURSDAY 26 SEPTEMBER 2013

AMALGAMATION OF LOTS IN MENZIES:

An application to amalgamate two lots of land behind the school in Menzies has been approved by Council. While this is generally against Council's wishes, it was felt that these two lots would not create neither a precedent nor reduce the possibility of having two separate lots with buildings on them due to their relative isolation.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT REFORM:

Council has agreed to advise the Minister for Local Government and the Shadow Minister for Local Government that it does not support the proposed removal of the "Dadour" provisions from Schedule 2.1 of the *Local Government Act 1995*. The proposed removal of this clause would take away the right of the community to have their say on whether the Shire is amalgamated with another Shire at the government's whim.

GOLDFIELDS ESPERANCE TOURISM ALLIANCE:

Council has been asked whether they wish to become a partner in the Goldfields Esperance Tourism Alliance (GETA) as proposed by the Goldfields Esperance Development Commission (GEDC). This proposal has been in progress for a number of years but the recent list of priorities for Menzies has never been to Council and a number do not have any body listed as the responsible authority. It was felt that as the Shire is already a contributing partner to a number of active tourism bodies now, a new organisation was not attractive to Menzies.

MAIN STREET DEVELOPMENT:

Council has agreed to have Mr Bret Howson prepare a draft drawing of the proposed main street median strip development for presentation to main Roads for their approval. Funding for this project has been approved in the Budget and approval is required from MR WA before any further progress can be made on this matter. It is planned that upgrading for the project will be completed in this financial year.

POLICY MANUAL REVIEW:

Council has approved a review of the Policy Manual for the next twelve months. While a Policy Manual is not a legislative requirement under the *Local Government Act 1995*, it is a guide as to how the operations of the Shire will comply with the *Act*. The policy manual has an administrative review each year with a full Council review every second year. A copy of this Manual is available at the Shire office for perusal.

REVIEW OF DELEGATION REGISTER:

Council Adopted, by an Absolute Majority Decision, a review of the Delegation Register. The Delegation Register, unlike the Policy Manual, is a legislative requirement under the *Local Government Act 1995*. This requirement enables the Council to delegate certain functions of the local government to the CEO and other staff to enable the ongoing operations of the Council. All Delegations from Council must be listed with the CEO then sub delegating certain functions to other officers. A copy of the Delegation Register is available at the Shire office for perusal.

NOMINATION REQUIREMENTS

Candidates are required to lodge with the Returning Officer:

- a completed nomination in the prescribed form, signed and witnessed. This form is available from the Returning Officer, the Western Australian Electoral Commission website (www.waec.wa.gov.au) or the Shire of Menzies
- a single A4 page profile containing not more than 150 words of information about the candidate
- a nomination deposit of \$80 (cash, bank cheque or postal order)
- a recent passport-sized photograph (optional).

Where an agent lodges a nomination on a candidate's behalf, it must be in the prescribed form with a written authorisation signed by the candidate.

The documents may be hand delivered, posted or faxed to the Returning Officer and must be received by the close of nominations.

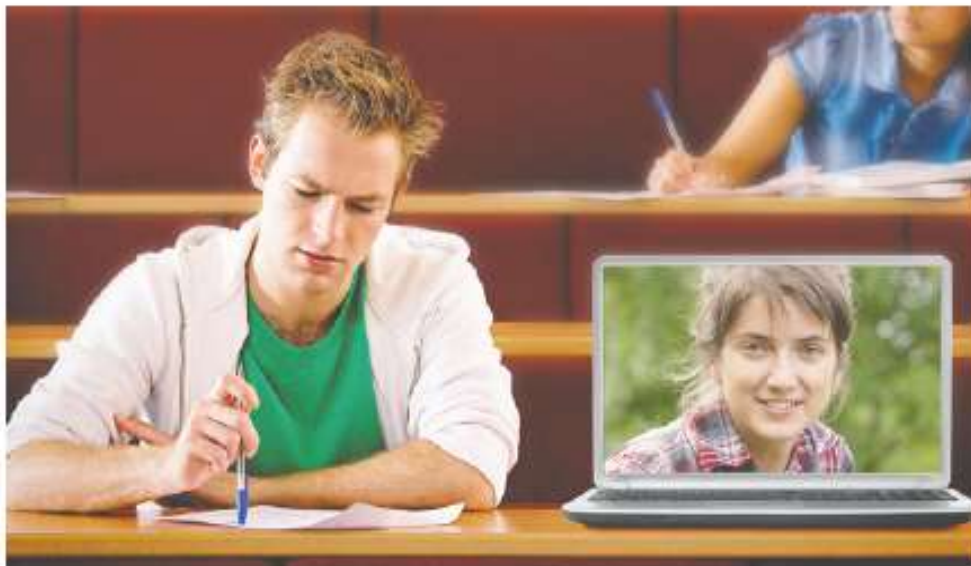
COOL CRC Grants

South Australia, New South Wales, Victoria, and Tasmania start daylight saving on the first Sunday in October.



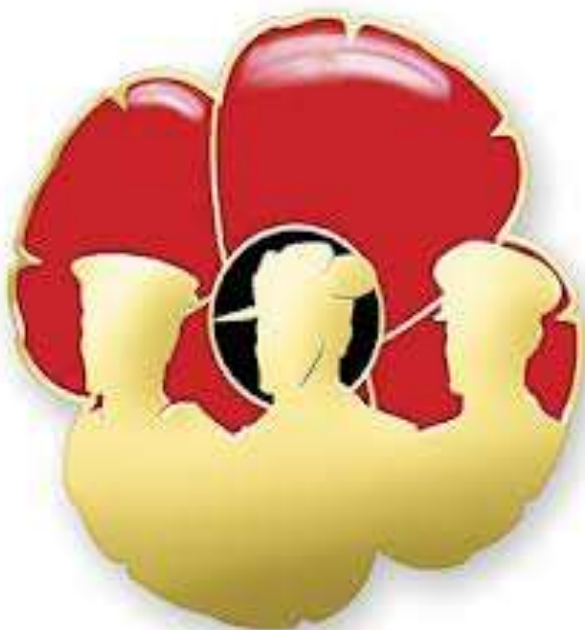

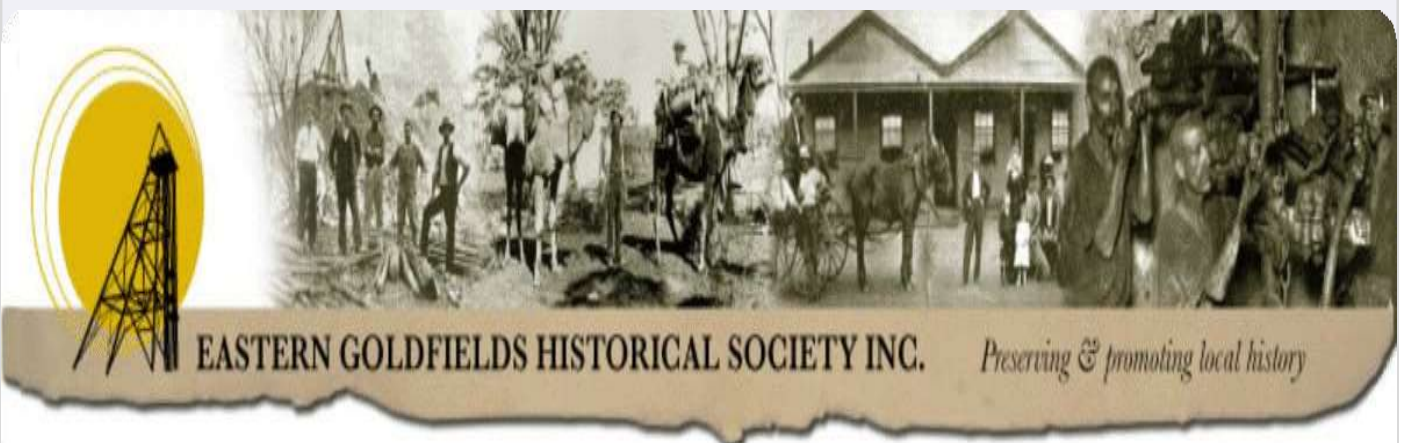


GOONGARRIE

Gold was found in Goongarrie in May 1893 by Billy Frost and Jack Bennett. The site was the first important gold discovery after Coolgardie (before Kalgoorlie).

Originally known as the Roaring Gimlet of the Ninety Mile (its distance from Coolgardie), this once prosperous town boasted a post and telegraph office, two hotels and several shops which did a good trade as a stopover for the daily coach from Coolgardie to Menzies.

Both the failure of the local mine and the coming of the railway put an end to the town's prosperity.
