CEO's Message

At its Ordinary Meeting held on 26 September 2024, the Council made several key decisions.

First, the scope of works for Stage 1 of the Old

Post Office Restoration project, focused on reinstating both the structural and aesthetic integrity of the building, was noted. The tender process for this stage will follow a schedule of rates for works up to a total value of \$500,000.

Second, the Council endorsed the scope of works for Stage 1 of the Niagara Dam project, which aims to further investigate and understand the historical significance of the site. This tender will also follow a schedule of rates, with a total value of up to \$225,000.

In addition to these restoration projects, the Council adopted a new policy on the acquisition, display, and management of art. This policy will guide future decisions regarding the Shire's art collection and ensure that art pieces are properly maintained and exhibited for the benefit of the community.

Although it is still early in the planning stage,

the Shire is working on a project that will result in the historic Goongarrie Station Masters house having a new lease of life. The building is structurally sound but in need of some care and attention. The plan is to bring the building up to a standard where it will once again have a functioning role as accommodation and an office. This will help preserve the building and provide additional surveillance over other heritage cottages in the area that are subject to vandalism.

Looking ahead, the Shire will be hosting a community workshop on 30 October 2024 to discuss key developments such as the Skate Park and the proposed Gym, and Nature Based Playground. Community members are encouraged to participate in this workshop to provide feedback and input on these projects, which aim to enhance the recreational facilities in Menzies.

These actions reflect the Council's dedication to preserving both the cultural and historical heritage of Menzies while focusing on future developments that promote community well-being.


Snake Season

Escape from Lock-up

John Smith, the escapee from the Menzies lock-up, is still at large, and as far as present indications show, he may continue to be. Nothing has been learned in regard to his whereabouts, and the police have no idea what direction he has taken. It is thought that he cannot have left the district by rail, as the trains have been watched at Menzies and Woolgar, while the police at Kalgoorlie, where Smith is well known, have been apprised of the escape. Smith is also known to the police in the northern districts, and his capture should be effected.

The Public Works Department is responsible for the faulty nature of the locks at the watch-house, and until improved locks are put in use there will always be a danger of prisoners escaping. Seeing that a prisoner escaped several months ago, by the very simple process of unscrewing the bolts which hold the lock, It was culpable negligence on the part of the police department not to have made the lock-up secure; but possibly some action may be taken to repair the cage now that the two have flown.

The man who escaped previously was incarcerated on a trivial charge, and it does not seem to have dawned on the department that a

man charged with a capital offence could possibly follow the example set him. It is not to the local officers that blame is attachable, but to the higher authorities. As a matter of fact, a prisoner could be so fastened in at present as to render his escape impossible. There are double doors to the lock-up, the inner door being of iron bars and the outer of heavy wood. Were the wooden doors kept locked it would be impossible for them to be opened from the inside, but there would then be practically no ventilation in the cells. To confine a man in that way during hot weather would be absolutely cruel, and would render him liable almost to suffocation. All that is needed is a secure lock for each of the iron bar doors, and the failure to provide such locks is proof of the grossest negligence on the part of the departmental officials.

The direct result of this negligence in the present case is that a man charged with attempted robbery, assault with intent to do grievous bodily harm, and shooting with intent to murder, is at large, with no immediate prospect of his being recaptured.

Yilpa Class

Through imaginative play, Yilpa class is not only having fun but also learning important lessons about collaboration and teamwork. Our craft sessions have allowed the children to explore their creativity while practicing their fine motor skills.



The joy of blending letters and sounds to form new words continues to be a highlight for our young learners. Each day, we practice spelling and writing, helping students to build confidence in their reading and writing abilities.

Maths in Yilpa Class is all about hands-on learning. We use concrete objects to explore concepts like "more" and "less, " and students enjoy grouping items to create simple addition sentences.

Our music sessions with Mr Lindsay are filled with energy as we sing songs and make music together.

We were thrilled to have the Stephen Michael Foundation join us, bringing in fun activities that got us all thinking about kindness and trust. See photos above.


MARLU CLASS
