#### **Shire President's Report**

I am pleased to share insights from recent discussions at key events in the local government sector.

#### Northern Goldfields Working Group Meeting

On September 27, I attended the Northern Goldfields Working Group (NGWG) meeting in Leonora. We had a productive discussion regarding issues affecting our area, including antisocial behaviour, alcohol sales, and the Great Central Road.

#### **WALGA Local Government Convention**

From October 8 to 10, I, along with other Council Members and the Chief Executive Officer, attended the WALGA Local Government Convention in Perth. A major topic of discussion was the cost of living, recognised as a pressing issue for ratepayers. The convention also covered important trends in local government and the potential forms of disruption

anticipated in the coming decade. A panel of key political observers shared valuable insights into the issues affecting local governments in the lead-up to the next election. Additionally, there was a spotlight on regional telecommunications and renewable technology innovations in Western Australia. The convention featured excellent stalls showcasing the latest products, machinery, and technology, and it provided great networking opportunities with other local government representatives.

On October 8, GVROC organised a dinner for its delegates, which I and other Council Members attended. This event provided an excellent opportunity for networking and building connections among members of the local government sector.

#### **Acting CEO's Message**

At its ordinary meeting held on Thursday, 31 October 2024, the Council made several key decisions.

Firstly, I would like to express my appreciation for the teamwork demonstrated by the Shire staff and auditors in ensuring the timely completion of the Annual Audit for year ending 30 June 2024. The exit meeting conducted by the Office of the Auditor General and RSM Australia was well presented at the Audit and Risk Committee meeting on 31 October 2024. The Audited Financial Report is to be presented at the Annual Electors Meeting.

Secondly, the Council endorsed the Community Christmas Party, which will be held on Thursday, 19 December 2024, at the Ngalipaku Youth Centre from 4:30 PM to 8:00 PM. As part of this celebration, there will be a Christmas Light Competition, with the winners being announced at the Community Christmas Party. Furthermore, the Council endorsed the schedule for the Christmas closure of the Shire Administration Office and Shire Depot, the reduced opening hours of the Community Resource Centre, and general rubbish collection schedule over the Christmas period.

An update to the Government Regional Officer Housing (GROH) project is that it is on schedule.

Looking ahead, and due to increased interest from residents, the Shire of Menzies will take the opportunity to sell, through public auction, several blocks of land owned by the Shire in Menzies, in Menzies and Kookynie. We encourage residents to participate in the event.

Thank you to everyone who participated in the skatepark community consultation and community feedback for the nature playground and community gym. We received a lot of positive responses and will be glad to share the results in the December Menzies Matters.


#### **MR STEPHEN JOHN TONKIN**

#### **Eastern Goldfields Historical Society**

North Coolgardie Herald and Miners Daily News, November 1901, reported, "OPENING OF THE RIFLE RANGE – The new rifle range for the Menzies Volunteer Corps was opened yesterday in the presence of a considerable number of residents. Prior to the opening ceremony, the Corps marched through the streets, presenting a very smart appearance in their khaki uniforms. Mrs Owen fired the first shot at the target and registered a bulls-eye, amidst cheers." Images taken from the Eastern Goldfields Historical Collection.

#### Early Menzies by George Spencer Compton (Eastern Goldfields Historical Society)

After Coolgardie (September 1892) the probing fingers of exploration pushed outwards still further into country unknown: it was an orderly sequence of finds that gave the "25-mile: 45-mile and the 90-mile". In all the long years since, the 90-Mile (or Goongarrie) has yielded only about 3,500 ozs of alluvial and specimen gold, with 22,000 ozs from 32,000 tons milled – not a very glamorous record – and yet Goongarrie was, in '93 and '94 a place most satisfying to guite a few men. It is highly likely that a lot of early ounces were never reported, and went into the "chamois" without fuss. It was a 'small man's area' with many rich prizes. Leaving Coolgardie, the track lead out, past Menzie and McDonald were out in the bush on Mt. Burges, to the 25-Mile: the 45-Mile then to Canegrass and so to the 90-Mile. No enticing country lay between and very little water: the further from Coolgardie the fewer the comforts! Yet here and there the little gold that was encouraging: the gold that optimism seemed to make shine more brightly and hope to magnify in amount. Two hundred miles back to Southern Cross, therefore very few frills on the menu!

Along the track some few hardy souls moved: a few strings of camels carted their stores. In due

course Tobias Bros. of Coolgardie set up a forward store there, and their manager was a man destined to occupy a very prominent place on the North Coolgardie stage, Harry Gregory.

In '94 the probing fingers pushed out again: this time from Goongarrie taking J.J. Brown, C. Kirkby and C. Jackman to a point 20 miles on. They were on gold, sank a shaft; did their mining and prospecting work well and according to the rules: but the place just did not seem to be good enough to warrant a title: while four miles further on, on a little stony outcrop (of scattered specimens) L.R. MENZIE and J. McDonald's camels kicked over a few rich floaters. The spot became "The Lady Shenton Mine".

behalf of a Perth Syndicate (Sir George Shenton, H.J. Saunders, R.F. Sholl, N. McNeill and others). After tracing the rich outcrop for a few hundred feet by the stones that lay scattered about with gold in them like small pellets, the two rode back to Coolgardie. On 1st October 1894 the find was registered: Lease No. 1380 in the name of Menzie and Sir George Shenton: and lease 1381 for Menzie and R.F. Sholl. These became "The Lady Shenton Mine" and the place MENZIES.
