THE SHIRE PRESIDENT'S REPORT



Friday 8 November 2019

I attended the Regional Road Group (RRG) meeting in Kalgoorlie. Main Roads (Kalgoorlie) will be requesting a monthly Project Status Update and Invoice Information, which will be most beneficial for Shire delegates in their roles in RRG.

Wednesday 13 November 2019

Whilst in Perth, Cr Dwyer and I took the opportunity to visit the manufacturing facilities of both Fox Transport and Modular WA in Gngalara to inspect display units and building quality.

Thursday 14 November 2019

Prior to leaving Perth we visited Thermal Comfort in Hope Valley and then travelled to Quairading to meet with the Shire Chief Executive Officer, Graeme Fardon, to inspect the Shire's recently installed Caravan Park cabins.

Friday 15 November 2019

The Chief Executive Officer and I attended the Goldfields Voluntary Regional Organisation of Councils (GVROC) rescheduled meeting in Kalgoorlie. Matters that generated discussion included the Establishment of a Drought Committee, appropriate Bushfire Fighting Vehicles, Strategic Working Groups and a Website.

Thursday 21 November 2019

The Chief Executive Officer and I attended a session with Minister Littleproud, Minister for Water Resources and Drought. Local Governments will be hearing from his Department in the near future regarding funding to assist Local Governments in the Southern Rangelands. I also attended the session between the Minister and Pastoralists concerning their current assessment of conditions on stations, particularly off the Trans Access Road.

Friday 22 November 2019

Via teleconference I joined in on the Annual General Meeting (AGM) and Board meeting of the Golden Quest Discovery Trail Association. Sarah Hinton has been employed as part-time Administration Officer for the interim.

FERAL CACTUS

I know many locals like to spend time out in the bush (maybe not so much this time of year) and I ask you to keep your eye out for cactus and help prevent it spreading.

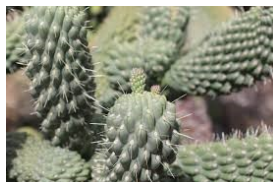
As you know Australia has no native cactus – every cactus you see was brought into the country for various reasons but now it is widespread and, in some places, out of control.

There are many varieties of feral cactus and in some locations, it's spread has not been controlled. Governments (state & local) and property owners are obligated to control and eradicate cactus on property they own or manage.

There are some mining companies and property owners trying various methods, that over time may result in faster and less expensive means of killing the plants.

In the meantime, through 2020 and onwards, this Shire intends to carry out a significant poisoning program to ensure we keep this plant under some control and ultimately we aim for eradication.

When camping, bush walking or driving please be careful not to spread the cactus plants and if you do find large infestations please let us know and we will act on your information



DROUGHT FUNDING

The Federal Government is creating a Drought Resilience Funding Plan with an initial credit of \$3.9 billion and \$100 million will be made available each year to support Australian farmers and communities to prepare becoming resilient to the effects of future droughts.



Menzies Shire appears to be less affected than other areas of WA and Australia, but this does not mean we should be complacent. The Council will be looking at projects for which we may be able to get Federal funding for infrastructure that will help make this Shire drought resilient into the future.

THE CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER

NO CHILDREN IN THE HOTEL

Parents, children are not allowed to enter the Hotel unless accompanied by an adult. This includes the area at the rear bar where the fridges are located. This is also a licensed area.



The licence of the Hotel can face severe penalties if a child enters the hotel area without an adult – the proprietor has no choice – it is the law.

A child cannot come into the hotel even to buy an ice cream, sandwich or whatever. The hotel has every right and should refuse service if the child is not with an adult.

MIGRANT WORKERS FOR EMPLOYERS

The City of Kalgoorlie-Boulder and the Australian Government have reached an agreement on the Goldfields Designated Area Migration Agreement (DAMA).



The Goldfields DAMA is a five year labour agreement between the Federal Government, the City of Kalgoorlie-Boulder and the Shires of Coolgardie, Leonora and Menzies. It aims to attract skilled migrants to work and live in Kalgoorlie-Boulder, Coolgardie, Leonora and Menzies, allowing Goldfields employers to sponsor skilled overseas workers in specified industries that are currently experiencing critical skill and labour shortages. We always advocate that employment should be offered to Australians first. Where there is a skills shortage, we believe skilled migrants are critical to supplement the local workforce.

Information for Employers

A DAMA is a labour agreement between a Designated Area Representative (DAR) and the Australian Government to fill labour shortages in a specific area with skilled migrants.

The City of Kalgoorlie-Boulder is the Goldfields DAR and is responsible for the Goldfields DAMA program and processes.

An employer may access a range of visa options when Australian workers are not available to meet local labour market shortages, including the use of a DAMA.

To access a DAMA labour agreement with the Australian Government, a Goldfields employer must meet the following core criteria:

- the business is actively operating for at least 12 months, and financially viable;
- the business is located within the City of Kalgoorlie-Boulder, Shires of Coolgardie, Leonora, or Menzies;
- the occupation it seeks to fill is listed in the current approved Goldfields DAMA occupation list; and
- the business can pass the Labour Market Testing requirements, including providing evidence that it cannot attract an Australian citizen or resident to fill the position.

Before applying to the Goldfields DAR for a DAMA, please ensure that you have completed and can pass the mandatory labour market testing (LMT).

Information for Migrants

A DAMA program is an employer-sponsored program and individual workers cannot apply independently.

Workers who are successfully sponsored under the Goldfields DAMA are either granted a labour agreement stream of the Temporary Skill Shortage (TSS) visa (subclass 482), or the Employer Nominated Scheme (ENS) visa (subclass 186).

A TSS visa does not have an age limit, however employers and workers applying to access the permanent residence pathway through an ENS visa must be aware that this has an age limit of 49 years old (cannot have turned 50) at the time of permanent residency nomination.

The Goldfields DAMA requires the workers to work and live in the region in the same occupation for a certain period. A permanent residency sponsorship is an employer's choice.

The Goldfields DAR do not offer job-matching services to potential skilled migrants. It is up to the individual to reach out to businesses, and apply for the job directly.

Goldfields employers must first apply to the Goldfields DAR for endorsement before entering into an individual DAMA labour agreement with the Australian Government. The Australian Government Department of Home Affairs is responsible for making labour agreements and all visa decisions.

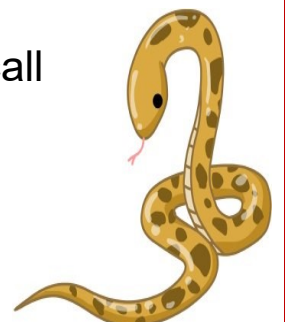

Prevent mosquito bites

COVER UP

Wear long, loose-fitting, light coloured clothing, covering as much of the body as you can. Mosquitoes can bite through tight clothes like jeans. Make sure children are also covered up.



REPEL

Use insect repellent containing DEET (diethyltoluamide) or picaridin and always follow instructions on the label.



CLEAN UP

Stop mosquitoes breeding in water pooling around your home or holiday accommodation by emptying water from



SEVEN GOLDEN RULES FOR PROSPECTING

1.

Put safety first

- Make sure you have enough water, fuel, maps and first aid supplies.
- Give serious consideration to taking some form of telecommunications and a global positioning system to fix locations, and a Personal Locator Beacon (PLB) – it may turn out to be your most important safety device.

2.

Obtain a Miner's Right permit

when prospecting on vacant Crown land (\$25 from any Mining Registrar's office).

3.

Obtain a 40E permit

prior to prospecting within an exploration tenement (if you don't have written permission from the tenement holder).

4.

Get written permission

- from the tenement holder when prospecting on:
- a mining lease
 - an exploration licence (if you don't have a 40E permit)
 - a prospecting licence

5.

Comply with all legal requirements

when prospecting on a pastoral lease. You cannot prospect within 100 metres of any occupied building or within 400 metres of any livestock watering point without the consent of the pastoralist.

6.

Show respect when on Crown land

because it is used by other people or set aside for many purposes.

7.

Fill any holes

that you dug and repair ground that has been disturbed.

1080 BAITING IN THIS AREA IS A RISK TO DOMESTIC PETS

Please be advised that baiting programs using 1080 poison are carried out across Western Australia, including this area, and are aimed at controlling wild dogs, feral cats, feral pigs, foxes and rabbits. The poison baits remain toxic for many months. You need to exercise caution. Domestic pets should be kept close and under control at all times. Owners may consider the use of leads and muzzles for their domestic pets.

WARNING SIGNS ARE PLACED WHERE APPLICABLE, HOWEVER THEY MAY BE DAMAGED, REMOVED, VANDALISED OR DESTROYED

1080 baiting is part of an integrated pest management program protecting livestock from death and injury; reducing the impact on pastoral and agricultural production; and helping to preserve the unique flora and fauna of WA. Baits are not intentionally laid in public areas such as road reserves, parking bays, rest stops or roadhouses however can be inadvertently moved into these areas by animals and birds.

DATES TO REMEMBER IN 2019/2020

Please note that penalties apply where burning regulations are contravened or permit conditions are not complied with

Prohibited Burning Period:

From 1 November 2019 to 15 March 2020 (inclusive)

All burning, including garden refuse is prohibited during this period.

Properties to be maintained clear of flammable material until 15 March 2019.

Restricted Burning Periods 2:

From 16 March 2020 to 30 April 2020 (inclusive)

Permits to burn are required during this period for hazard reduction burning.

Please note that penalties apply where burning regulations are contravened or permit conditions are not complied with.

Certain climate or weather conditions may cause these periods to be extended or shortened.

You must check the press for details

or call the Shire office on (08) 9024 2041 before commencing to burn.

Unrestricted Season:

From 1 May 2020 to 18 September 2020 (inclusive)

Restricted Burning Periods 1:

19 September 2019 to 31 October 2020 (inclusive)

Permits to burn are required during this period for hazard reduction burning.

Alternative firebreak applications to be submitted by 1 October 2019.

Firebreaks must be installed by 15 October 2019.

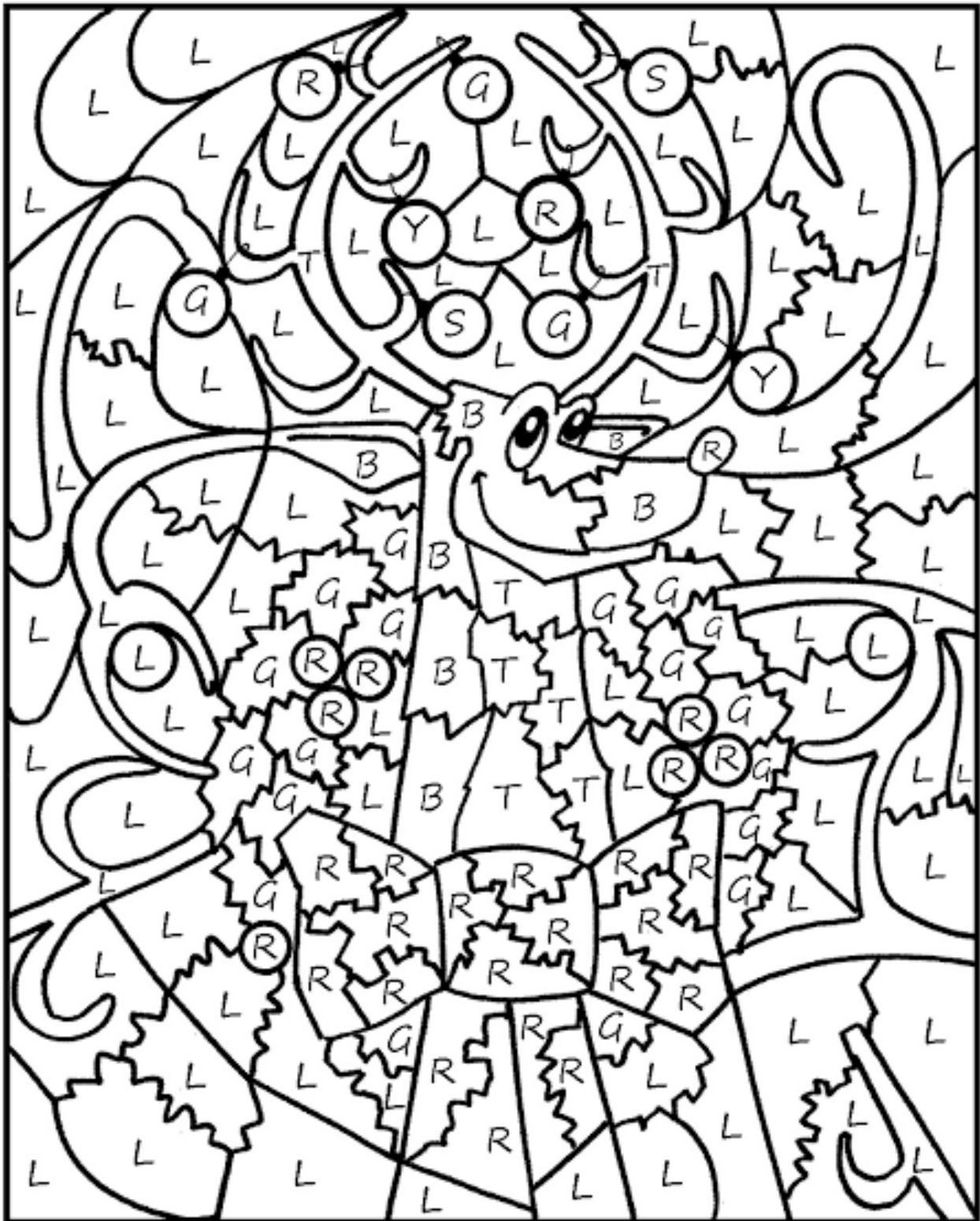
